RC continued to facilitating access to and preserving the information and knowledge resources required by students as well as staff members and enabling access to an enriched environment for learning and research. RC supports vision and mission of the institute by making available a wide variety of information resources relevant to curriculum and personal enrichment. It responds to the changing academic, occupational, technological and cultural needs of the user community.

RC is fully automated. Every function of the RC has been operated by the software "SOUL 2.0". The SOUL 2.0 consists of Acquisition, Catalogue, Circulation, OPAC, Serial and Administration modules. Each module has further been divided into sub modules to cater to its functional requirements. Bibliographical details of the Project Reports are also included in the software.

The donations of around 70 books by GATE FORUM and 8 books by our students are accepted during the last academic year.

1. Approximately 20281 number of documents are circulated during the year, out of which 2241 were from Civil Engineering, 3986 were from Computer Engineering, 2196 were from Electronics and Communication Engineering & 453 from Electrical Engineering, 2946 were from Information Technology Engineering, 5364 were from Mechanical Engineering and rest were from Maths and Humanities and General Interest

2. Book Bank: The Book Bank facility helped the economically weaker students. During the year 21 students availed this facility and borrowed approximately 85 books from this collection.

3. Information Alert Services: Alerts for new arrivals, arrival of requested resources, details of forthcoming national and international events are regularly mailed to the staff members of the institute for their reference during the year.

Geo Synchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV)-D5 with Indigenous Cryogenic Rocket Stage

After 20 years of toil, the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) on 5th January, 2014 took a quantum leap in mastering a rocket technology that puts it in the big league of space faring nations, following a demonstration of the first-ever perfect performance of its indigenously developed cryogenic engine in the course of a successful flight of its Geo Synchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV).

With this, India joined the “Cryo club”, a selected group of space faring nations having the crucial cryogenic engine technology, which is necessary to carry heavy satellites. Countries which have such a capability are the US, Russia, France, Japan and China.

India has developed and commissioned Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle (PSLV) and Geo Synchronous Satellite Launch Vehicle (GSLV).



GSLV is capable of launching 2,000 kg class satellites into the geosynchronous transfer orbit (GTO). GSLV Mark-III, which can place 4,000 kg class satellites into the GTO, is under development. PSLV can launch 1850 kg class remote sensing satellites into a 480 km polar Orbit. It can also place a satellite weighing about 1150 kg in GTO or a 3500 kg class satellite in Low Earth Orbit.

So far India has to depend on other countries to launch heavy weight (more than 3 tones) and has been shelling out huge money. According to a senior ISRO official India has been paying around \$85-90 million (around Rs 500 crore) as launch fee to foreign space agencies for sending up to a 3.5 tone communication satellites. In the absence of a reliable heavy lift rocket technology India has relied on France for launching its heavy class of satellites. ISRO has carried out 68 launches since 1975, out of which 26 were from locations outside India.

GSLV is a three-stage launch vehicle with solid, liquid and cryogenic stages. It is designed to inject 2 Ton class of communication satellites to GTO. The four liquid L40 strap-ons as well as the second stage of GSLV use storable liquid propellants.

GSLV-D5 vehicle is configured with its first and second stage similar to the ones flown during earlier GSLV missions. The third stage is the indigenous cryogenic stage. The metallic payload fairing with a diameter of 3.4 meter is adopted for GSLV-D5. S-band telemetry and C-band transponders enable GSLV-D5 performance monitoring, tracking, range safety/flight safety and Preliminary Orbit Determination.

A Cryogenic rocket stage is more efficient and provides more thrust for every kilogram of propellant it burns compared to solid and earth-storable liquid propellant rocket stages. Specific impulse (a measure of the efficiency) achievable with cryogenic propellants (liquid Hydrogen and liquid Oxygen) is much higher compared to earth storable liquid and solid propellants, giving it a substantial payload advantage. The specific impulse achievable with cryo fluids is 450 seconds compared to 300 seconds for other fuels.

However, cryogenic stage is technically a very complex system compared to solid or earth-storable liquid propellant stages due to its use of propellants at extremely low temperatures and the associated thermal and structural problems. Oxygen liquefies at -183°C and Hydrogen at -253°C . The propellants, at these low temperatures are to be pumped using turbo pumps running at around 40,000 rpm. It also entails complex ground support systems like propellant storage and filling systems, cryo engine and stage.

The successful testing of the indigenous GSLV will push through preparations for India's second mission to the moon Chandrayaan 2 where ISRO proposes to land a rover on the moon.

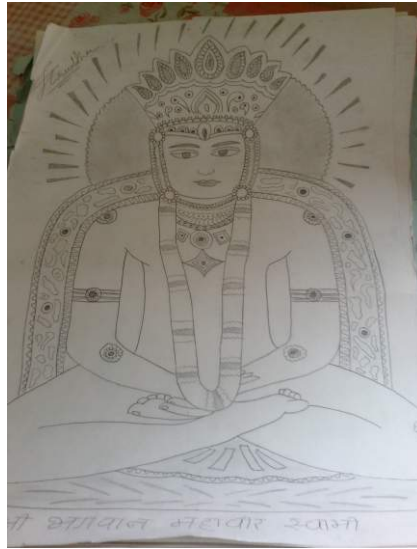
